

1 Enjoy scenic bike routes and segments of the 2020 Tokyo Olympic Cycling Course

COURSE

Total length: about 54km/34mi

Introducing the course

This cycling course will take you past local landmarks and segments of the 2020 Tokyo Olympic Road Race Course. You can also enjoy seasonal flora along the way, such as cherry blossoms in spring. It's easy to get out and have fun cycling if you use rental bikes. Check the map on the other side of this brochure for more info on bike rentals.

Route

MAP D2

Keio Line [Tobitakyu Sta.] = Ajinomoto Stadium = Musashino-no-Mori Park = Nogawa Park
The nearest to Ajinomoto Stadium. A great spot for bird-watching.

= Tama Reien Cemetery = Okunitama-jinja Shrine = JRA Tokyo Racecourse = Omaru
Many famous Japanese tombstones. See the splendid Babadaimon no Keyaki Namiki (two rows of Zelkova trees along an avenue).

Shinsui Park = Misawagawa River = Kujira Bridge = Sakuragaoka Park = Tama New Town
The place will make you want to take a stroll down the waterside. Visit the Kyu-tama Seisaku Memorial Hall. On both sides of Kamimone Ave.

Apartment Complex = Sanrio Puroland = Tama Zoological Park = Takahata Fudo-son Temple
See the blooming hydrangeas from May to June.

= Takahata Bridge = Shinsengumi Furusato Historical Museum = Hino-shuku Honjin =
Asakawa River. Dress up like a samurai.

Kyodo-no-Mori Park = Keio Line/JR Nambu Line [Bubaigawara Sta.]

MAP C2

Wonderful places to visit

Okunitama-jinja Shrine (Fuchu City)
 The main shrine of the ancient Musashi Province with its deity Okunitama. Kurayami Matsuri Festival, celebrated in May, is counted as one of the three unusual festivals in the Kanto region. (MapC2)

Omaru Shinsui Park (Inagi City)
 A park next to the Omaru irrigation channel, used to water crops ever since the Edo period. It has lovely landscapes throughout the year: spring - cherry trees, summer - hydrangeas and fall - rice fields. (MapC2)

Sanrio Puroland (Tama City)
 An indoor theme park where you can meet many famous Sanrio characters e.g. Hello Kitty. It offers musicals and parades regularly and is a favorite location for kids. (MapB3)

Hino-shuku Honjin (Hino City)
 Built in the Edo period, this building is the only remaining Honjin facility in Tokyo. There was formerly a dojo on the premises, where Kondo Isami and Hijikata Toshizo trained before becoming the Commander and Vice-commander of the Shinsengumi. (MapA)

3 Springtime trip across the paths full of flowers in the four cities in the Tama

COURSE

Total length: about 37km/23mi

Introducing the course

This course runs through the parks, flower gardens and walking paths which are known for plum and cherry trees, as well as camellias, witch hazels, magnolia kobus and many other spring flowers. For wonderful views, we recommend Sakimori-Mikaeri-no-Toge* (lit. observation deck of a garrisoned soldier** who looked back).

*Anecdote: A song sang by a garrisoned soldier's wife when her husband was sent to Tsukushi Province (present-day Fukuoka Prefecture): just like it is horrible for a wild horse to be captured, my husband has been sent as a garrison soldier to the Tama Yokoyama-no-Michi Path in Tama.
 **A soldier sent to defend one of the main regions of the land.

Wonderful places to visit

Tama Reien Cemetery (Fuchu City)
 Japan's first public cemetery. As a metropolitan cemetery it occupies a large area, about 27 times the area of the Tokyo Dome. There are many tombstones of famous people here. (MapD1)

Misawagawa River (Inagi City)
 It is a very popular spot for cherry blossom viewing with about 320 cherry trees, so you can enjoy the seasonal colors as you stroll by. Many people visit the place in spring. (MapD1)

Sakimori-Mikaeri-no-Toge (Tama City)
 A place on the Tama Yokoyama-no-Michi Path in Tama, which is related to a poem from the Manyoshu collection of Japanese poetry. The most outstanding view of the Tama New Town. (MapC4)

Keio Mogusaen (Hino City)
 Designated as a place of scenic beauty with around 300 plum trees and a historical landmark with a tanka inscription by Bokusui Wakayama and a slab with a haiku by Matsuo Basho. Between February and March, there is a Plum Festival here. (MapB2)

2 Walk along the waterfront and find these lovely blue birds - kingfishers!

COURSE

Total length: about 34km/21mi

Introducing the course

For generations, the Tama River, its side rivers and channels (in the four cities) have been taken care of to protect their surrounding nature. Thanks to water-purification techniques, the deep sky-blue birds - kingfishers, a symbol of the area, can be seen once again. They are one of the main attractions of this beautiful waterside course through natural landscape.

MAP C2

Key skills for spotting kingfishers

1 Listen carefully for their song!
 It is very similar to the sound of a bicycle riding down the hill with the breaks on. Kingfishers don't fly very high, they tend to stay close to the water surface, but they fly very fast in a straight line.

2 Keep a close eye on any branches or posts stuck near rivers or ponds!
 Kingfishers are likely to return to same spots if they are good for aiming at small fish in the water. These places are usually covered in their white droppings, so you can sometimes spot them there.

Wonderful places to visit

Kurokawa Seiryu Park (Hino City)
 You can learn all about the local animals, plants, events and the whole region at Kawasemi House, right next to this park. (MapA2)

Kottagawa River (Tama City)
 It flows into the Ogurigawa River, near Renkoji. It has a concrete, gentle river dike slope. Looking on the other side of the Ochai Bridge, you can see many cherry trees. (MapB3,C2,C3)

Kasayato Shinsui Park (Inagi City)
 The park retains its old landscape, where you can observe nature or play with water. You can also see the municipal bird - kestrel. (MapC3)

Suntory Tokyo Musashino Brewery (Fuchu City)
 Suntory's first brewery, where "The Premium Malts" beer was born. Guided tours of the brewery are available (reservation needed). (MapC2)

4 See historical sites from between the Jomon and Meiji periods

COURSE

Total length: about 27km / 17mi (except the railway route)

Introducing the course

There are traces of history of upheavals in the Tama area: historic ruins from the Jomon and Yayoi periods, traces of Nitta Yoshisada's overthrow of the shogunate, buildings visited by the Shinsengumi police force in the last years of the Edo period, and more. This course will let you relive the history of Japan in a single circuit.

Route

MAP A1

JR Chuo Line [Hino Sta.] = Shinsengumi Furusato Historical Museum = Yasakajinja Shrine =
The first of these Shinsengumi-related spots on this course

Takahata Fudo-son Temple = Keio Line [Takahatafudo Sta.] = Togoji
One of the Three Great Temples of Kanto. Built on the remains of Togo Heihachiro's villa, inspiration for Akira Kurosawa's Rashomon

Temple = Okunitama-jinja Shrine = Koanji Temple = Statue of Nitta Yoshisada = JR Nambu Line
An ancient temple built during the Muromachi Shogunate. First policy for flood control and irrigation during the Edo period.

[Bubaigawara Sta.] = JR Nambu Line [Minamitama Sta.] = Omaru Shinsui Park =
First policy for flood control and irrigation during the Edo period.

Omatonotsuno-tenjinsha Shrine = Aoijinja Shrine = Keio Sagami-hara Line [Inagi Sta.] = Keio Sagami-hara
A great view from the Inagi Bridge. Said to have been built to honor the god of water.

Line [Keio Nagayama Sta.] = Remains of the Sekido battlefield = Tama Yokoyama-no-Michi
Traces of a battle between the Kamakura Shogunate and Nitta Yoshisada's troops. Hijikata Toshizo and Kondo Isami walked down this trail

Path = Sakimori-Mikaeri-no-Toge = Karakida-no-Michi Path = Odakyu Tama Line [Karakida Sta.]

MAP B4

Wonderful places to visit

Shinsengumi Furusato Historical Museum (Hino City)
 This museum displays various materials related to the Shinsengumi, who had deep ties with the area. You can also dress up like a Shinsengumi samurai yourself for some great photographs or check out the Shinsengumi merchandise for sale. (MapA1)

Omatonotsuno-tenjinsha Shrine (Inagi City)
 This small shrine offers a view in the direction of Fuchu City and of the entire middle section of the Tama River. (MapC2)

Statue of Nitta Yoshisada (Fuchu City)
 Nitta Yoshisada gathered the troops necessary to overthrow the Kamakura Shogunate and the battle took place there. This statue was erected to commemorate the victory of Nitta's troops. (MapC2)

Remains of the Sekido battlefield (Tama City)
 Just before the downfall of the Kamakura Shogunate, Nitta Yoshisada and the Hojo troops fought a battle here. You can see the ruins from the Sekido battlefield along the former Kamakura highway. (MapC2)

A verdant city between the Tama and Asakawa Rivers with a rich history as the Shinsengumi's Hometown.

Hino City

Senosuke-Shinsengumi Samurai Mascot

Nestled between the Tama and Asa Rivers and dotted with around 180 freshwater springs, Hino was once affectionately known as Tama's rice granary for its clean waters and verdant land. Hino was also the hometown of several Shinsengumi leaders, including Vice-commander Hijikata Toshizo and the Captain of the sixth battalion, Inoue Genzaburo. Each year, the city holds the Hino Shinsengumi Festival, a massive celebration of the official samurai police force.

Shinsengumi Furusato Historical Museum | Takahata Fudo-son Temple | Tama Zoological Park

Before forming the Shinsengumi near the end of the Tokugawa shogunate's rule of Japan, Hijikata Toshizo, Inoue Genzaburo, Kondo Isami, and Okita Soji met in Hino. This museum displays materials related to the Shinsengumi samurai police force and local history. (MapA1)

For over a millennium, Takahata Fudo-son has been hailed as one of the three Great Fudo temples of Kanto. At over 100 kg, the main Acala statue is said to be one of the greatest in Japan. (MapB2)

This large zoo makes use of its surrounding greenery and has over 300 varieties of animals and insects. Some of its most popular animals include red pandas, koalas, snow leopards and orangutans. (MapA2,B2)

A neighboring city which has a train station equipped with very advanced functionality. The houses are right next to the greenery of the Tama Hills and aspect change with every new season.

Tama City

Nyantom-TAMAAburo, Advertisement character of Tama City

Around the Tama Center and Seiseiki-Sakuragaoka stations, there are some of the area's most sought after apartments with wonderful views from above the lush hills. It is said that people related to the Shinsengumi police force also visited the mountain ridge where the Tama Yokoyama-no-Michi Path is, so it is truly a sightseeing spot filled with history and romanticism.

The best walking trail in Japan | Yuhi Hill | Tama Central Park

Spreading across 41 km it avoids all the major roads and traffic. Connected to the mountain ridge where the Tama Yokoyama-no-Michi Path is, even warriors from the Kamakura Shogunate and the Shinsengumi police force have walked here. It also offers beautiful natural landscape. (MapB3,B4,C3,C4)

The best spot for gazing at the night-time scenery while sitting on the grass or on the benches, calmly watching the sun set under the horizon. In the twilight it becomes enveloped in a mysterious mood that is even more beautiful. (MapC3)

A large park area in the center of the Tama New Town. You can find here a plaza with a big expanse of grass and a pond, as well as the old Tomizawa House, the Green Life Center and many more wonderful places like these. (MapB3)

The Musashi Provincial Government used to be here. Everywhere in the city you can encounter traces of the history and advanced culture of this era in a form of numerous relics.

Fuchu City

Kotomichi-chen, Image Character of NPO corporation Fuchu City Tourism Association

The Musashi Provincial Government was established here about 1350 years ago. It was a place where things began to prosper early on, as a political, economic and cultural center. It became popular as a post station on the Koshu-kaido route during the Edo period, a place where countless people passed by. Fuchu is blessed with lush greenery, especially with its nationally designated natural monument - Babadaimon no Keyaki Namiki.

Babadaimon no Keyaki Namiki | Musashifuchu-Kumanojinja Shrine Tomb | JRA Tokyo Racecourse

Its origin is said to be in the planting of a seedling by Minamoto no Yoriyoshi and his son, Minamoto no Yoshie, as an expression of gratitude for having won the war. It is a stunning orchard of Zelkova trees. (MapC1)

The largest and oldest out of the three flat-topped circular burial mounds which have been restored in Japan. It is also a nationally designated historical landmark and cultural asset. (MapC1)

Japan's largest racetrack, where the Japanese Derby (the Tokyo Yushu, also known as the "horse racing festival") is held. The Japanese Oaks (the Yushu Himba) also takes place here, as well as the autumn Tenno Sho race, the Japan Cup and other Grade 1 horse races. (MapC2)

A city rich in culture, where water and greenery, history and the present day all coexist in harmony.

Inagi City

Inagi Nishinosuke, Official character of Inagi City

Surrounded by lush nature and fresh waters of the Tamagawa and Misawagawa rivers, it has the modern architecture of the Tama New Town, making it one of the nicest places to live in. A well-known place for the largest production of pears in all of the Tokyo Metropolitan Area. In April, the fields bloom with white flowers and create a beautiful landscape.

Pearterrace | Anasawa-tenjinsha Shrine | Inagi Kita Ryokuchi Park

The Inagi-Nagayama Station Tourist Information Center was founded under the station's overhead structure. You can find there information on sightseeing, purchasing local products, visiting art galleries and the wonders of Inagi City in general. (MapD3)

A shrine with the oldest history and cultural assets in Inagi. The water spring within the shrine grounds is included in the list of the 57 most famous water springs in Tokyo and it is said to be a sacred spring. (MapD3)

A park that offers a complete view of the Tama River. Here you can enjoy taking a walk, going running, playing tennis or other sports, and even having a picnic or a barbecue. (MapD2)
